Director's Notes - Tony Vokes

May I extend a very warm welcome to our production of 'That Good Night', a play written by N. J. Crisp.

Some months ago a parliamentary bill, with certain caveats, in respect of legalising assisted dying was narrowly passed. At the time of writing, this bill is awaiting presentation to The House of Lords.

It is therefore quite ironic that we should have chosen 'That Good Night' as our opening production for the 2025/2026 season. Little did we realise that an important content of the play would become such a relevant part of the nation's life.

As the director of the play I would like to impress on you that this is not a documentary type drama on the rights and wrongs of assisted dying. It is a brave and profound play, mixing comedy and philosophy. It's thought provoking and doesn't settle for any soft options and which shows a master storyteller, at the pinnacle of his powers. Thus the title 'That Good Night' from Dylan Thomas's famous poem "Do not go gentle into that good night" is aptly quoted. The poem is known for its powerful message about aging, death, and the human struggle to resist mortality. Compassionate in its expression of filial and marital love, it is not a play about euthanasia, but about the nature and meaning of life and in its way a kind of tragic love story.

Norman James Crisp was born on the 11th December 1923 in Southampton. He was known as a writer, only by his initials and surname.....**N. J. CRISP.**

In the 1960's he wrote scripts for the BBC series including 'Compact', 'Dixon of Dock Green', 'Dr. Finley's Casebook', 'Colditz' and 'Secret Army'. He also collaborated with producer Gerard Glaister in creating a serial called 'The Expert', which was about a forensic scientist. Four years later the pair repeated their roles with the boardroom drama, 'The Brothers'.

In 1987 he wrote the psychological thriller 'Dangerous Obsession' which our society presented in 1988.

His last play 'That Good Night', which is our current production, was written in 1999.

- N.J. Crisp was married to Marguerite Lowe. They had three sons and one daughter, and five grandchildren.
- N. J. Crisp died in Southampton on June 14th 2005 at the age of 81. I hope you enjoy our presentation.

About the Director - Tony Vokes

Tony is a true West Bridgfordian and has lived all his life in the area. He is proud of his long standing association with WBDS and has, at the last count directed twenty two plays for us, including *Veronica's Room* in 2022. He hopes you enjoy very much this production of *That Good Night*.


Richard Young


